For more than thirty years Frank served the church in Africa as a PC(USA) mission co-worker, focusing on ministries of health and development. A native of North Carolina, Frank has a master's degree in public health and completed doctoral work in international public health and epidemiology at Tulane. In 2010, he was awarded an honorary doctorate from Davidson College for his long and effective service to the church. Since 2017, Frank has helped to connect The



Outreach Foundation and U.S. churches with African church partners. He has facilitated work in trauma healing training and education for refugees and worked with vulnerable children and families. Frank also advises Presbyterian hospitals in Malawi (part-time) where he served for 14 years.

Frank and his wife, Nancy Miller Dimmock (daughter of retired missionaries) have eight children, six of whom are adopted. In addition to engaging in ministry in their home and raising their children, Nancy cofounded and coordinated the Ministry of Hope crisis nurseries in Southern Africa, a ministry serving abandoned and neglected infants and vulnerable children.
